Hello Willow Collectors!

Come celebrate the best of Lexington at IWC’s 39th Annual International Willow Collectors Convention: “Bluegrass & Bourbon” July 11-13, at the Doubletree Suites Hotel in Lexington on Richmond Road.

As you’ll see in this PDF document, we have planned a lot of great events for our willow weekend. Please read the information carefully. Come early or stay after and enjoy some of Lexington’s unique hospitality. Go to visitlex.com and learn more about planning a longer stay.

Everything you need to register for the convention is in this PDF. You must be a current member of IWC or the guest of a member to attend. Visit our website (willowcollectors.org) to join. Early Bird Registration is \$225 per person when postmarked on or before May 10, 2024. Postmarked on May 11 and after is \$250 per person. All registration forms must be returned and/or postmarked no later than June 10, 2024. Please note as you make travel plans that Lexington is in the Eastern Time Zone. The official convention starts on Thursday evening at 7:00 pm and ends on Saturday night. There is an optional area tour with an additional fee that begins Thursday morning, which means you may wish to stay in the hotel Wednesday night.

Your registration covers all convention events, lunches and dinners. Breakfast is on your own and available in the hotel or surrounding restaurants. The hotel offers the option of a breakfast buffet or by menu. See convention meals info in this packet.

The IWC Convention hotel room rate is \$127.00 per night, plus any taxes or fees. This rate is offered two days before and two days after the convention dates. The hotel is pet-friendly with a non-refundable deposit; ask for details with the hotel. Please make your hotel reservations as soon as possible with the information noted in this packet. The hotel reservation deadline is June 10, 2024 – after that time, we cannot guarantee the rooms or our special rate.

Print and fill out the appropriate pages and mail them back with your check or money order according to the information included.

After we process your registration, we will confirm your registration and participation.

Once again, we have decided to email registration packets to members to save on expenses. This PDF is also available on our website (willowcollectors.org) under the Conventions tab (2024 Convention). If you have a problem printing this PDF, please contact us.

2024 IWC CONVENTION HOTEL INFORMATION

WHERE: DoubleTree Suites by Hilton Hotel Lexington,
2601 Richmond Rd, Lexington, KY 40509

The hotel is part of a shopping center with businesses and small restaurants. Once registered, there is parking in back of the hotel with an entrance. Hotel room check-in is at 4:00 pm. Checkout is at 11:00 am.

RESERVATIONS: There are two ways to book your convention hotel room:



1) Contact The DoubleTree Suites by Hilton directly at 1-800-262-3774. If you need a special type of room or will request a pet-friendly room, it is best to call. To receive this special rate, mention your dates and that you are with the International Willow Collectors, as it benefits you and the club. The code for our special rate is ITL.

2) Go to our website (willowcollectors.org) and under the 'Conventions' tab, click on '2024 Convention.' Follow the instructions there.

Note: The hotel is pet friendly with a non-refundable pet fee. The hotel can explain the details and cost.

CONVENTION RATES: \$127.00 per night, plus applicable fees and taxes. As a courtesy, this rate is offered two days before and two days after the convention dates. Please note: this rate does not include breakfast, although it is available in the hotel.

CUT OFF DATE: Reserve your room prior to June 10 to ensure availability and rate.

CANCELLATION: Any hotel cancellation must be made by attendees directly with hotel.

AIRPORTS: There is no hotel/airport shuttle service offered. The Blue Grass Airport (airport code is LEX) is 12 miles away; Louisville International Airport, 80 miles; Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky International, 90 miles. You can check the airports' websites for ground transportation options.

2024 IWC CONVENTION HIGHLIGHTS

Wednesday, July 10

Joining the Horse Farm + Distillery Tour? It's best to make plans to arrive today so you're ready Thursday morning.

Dinner (So we can reserve space, confirm participation on registration form)

If you're in time for dinner, join us at a nearby restaurant (yet to be decided). We'll get together around 6:00 pm in the lobby. Open to all members and guests. This dinner is optional and at your own expense.

Thursday, July 11

For those arriving throughout today, you can explore the area (see visitlex.com) or settle in and visit with other attendees in the lobby or the hospitality room, where you'll find snacks and games. Bring willow puzzles if you have some (please label with your name). Hotel room check-in is at 4:00 pm. Checkout is at 11:00 am. Convention packets will be available for pick-up in the lobby at 3:00 pm.

Breeding Horse Farm Tour + Lunch + Buffalo Trace Distillery Tour (Additional registration. Confirm participation on registration form)

Each year, we plan a pre-convention, optional tour that highlights in some way the city or area we're in. This year's tour is again led by Shaun Washington of Unique Horse Farm Tours. Last year we visited foal horse farms, and this year we'll visit a breeding farm. We'll have a buffet lunch in Midway at the Brown Barrel. Remember those fun Blanton bourbon bottles with the various horses and jockeys we had at last year's banquet filled with fairy lights? After lunch, we are touring Buffalo Trace Distillery where Blanton is just one of the bourbons made. Seats will be limited on several mini buses and will be on a first-reserved and paid-for basis. We'll meet in the hotel lobby around 8:00 am. (leave at 8:30).

Hospitality Room (Confirm that you will donate snacks for this room on registration form)

We are fortunate that this year we can bring snacks into our hospitality room and we'd appreciate you donating something for everyone to enjoy. Since the room will be open throughout the convention, we ask that items be individually wrapped or in resealable containers. Think Little Debbie type snacks, peanut butter crackers, peanuts, pretzels in larger containers, small chip bags, etc. Anything that will keep fresh throughout the convention and not require special storage or handling.

Welcome Reception (So we can allow proper display space, confirm participation on registration form)

For those of you NOT attending the Horse Farm + Distillery tour, the official convention begins this evening at 7:00 pm with our welcome event. You'll be our special guest, where we'll meet and greet, show and tell, and enjoy some hors d'oeuvres. We'll even have small door-prize giveaways!

Here is where you can display items for Show & Tell, Throwback Thursday, as well as any Arts/Crafts and Place Settings. This year, both arts/crafts and place settings will not be competitions. So there are plenty of ways to participate: 1) bring willow items that are exceptional, unusual, a great buy or have a wonderful story; 2) bring a willow art or craft you have made; 3) create a small place setting using willow dishes; or 4) for Throwback Thursday, we'll go back to 2002 in Jacksonville, FL, where our convention theme was Make Mine Multi-Colored and we ask that you help us create a special display of multicolored or gaudy willow. Both members and guests are invited to bring items. Only willow-pattern-related items are allowed; please no other patterns.

The IWC Raffle (Confirm donations on registration form)

Here's a traditional event that takes place throughout the weekend. Attendees buy tickets with all proceeds going to IWC for the chance to win donated willow prizes. We ask you that you donate willow-related items for this raffle, but please consider your donations; everyone appreciates winning nice items. At the discretion of our raffle team, some items may be vetted or grouped together, or used in other ways throughout the convention. You may also donate items for a special raffle to be held at Saturday night's banquet. Proceeds from this raffle support the Connie Rogers Memorial Education Fund. 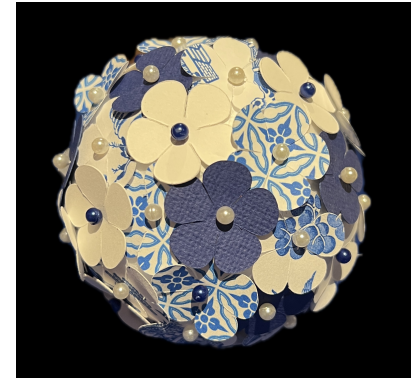

About the Brown Barrel: Situated on a site where bourbon was distilled for more than 100 years, the Brown Barrel will prepare a lunch buffet just for us. Last year's meal did not disappoint!

About the Buffalo Trace Distillery: This tour is an incredible introduction to the history and science of bourbon at Buffalo Trace Distillery. Their tour guides can teach guests of all levels and will bring the story of Buffalo Trace to life. All tours include a tasting of some of their award-winning products. - There will be a refund of the registration fee given if the convention chair(s) is notified on or before the early registration deadline.
