Hello Willow Collectors!

Be a part of IWC's 40th convention as we celebrate “The Arts of Willow,” July 9-12, at the Hilton Cincinnati Airport Hotel, in Florence, KY. Our special theme will offer presentations on film and fashion, fine art, history, music and more.

Is this your first convention or is someone attending with you as a first timer? **We're offering a Blue Plate Special discount for all first timers — \$50 off registration!** Just use the Blue Plate Special line on the registration form. We're excited to welcome you to your first IWC convention!

**Early Bird Registration is \$325 per person** when postmarked on or before May 10, 2025. Postmarked on May 11 and after is \$350 per person. **All registration forms must be returned and/or postmarked no later than June 13, 2025.** Please note as you make travel plans that Florence is in the Eastern Time Zone. The official convention starts on Wednesday evening at 7:30 pm and ends on Saturday night. There is an optional area tour with an additional fee that begins Wednesday morning, which means you may wish to stay in the hotel Tuesday night.

Your registration covers all convention events, lunches and dinners. Breakfast is on your own and available in the hotel's Kentucky Crave or surrounding restaurants. The hotel offers the option of a breakfast buffet or an a la carte menu with a 15% discount for IWC attendees. See convention meals info in this packet.

You'll notice an increase in this year's registration price. Members overwhelmingly preferred that an extra day be added to the convention (four days instead of three), so the 2025 registration reflects the cost of that extra day.

**The special IWC Convention hotel room rate is \$145.00 per night**, plus any taxes or fees. Please make your hotel reservations as soon as possible with the information noted in this packet. The hotel reservation deadline is June 11, 2025 – after that time, we cannot guarantee the rooms or our special rate.

Print and fill out the appropriate pages and mail them back with your check or money order according to the information included. After we process your registration, we will confirm your details.

## 2025 IWC CONVENTION HOTEL INFORMATION

**WHERE:** Hilton Cincinnati Airport, 7373 Turfway Road, Florence, KY 41042

Hotel room check-in is at 3:00 pm. Checkout is at Noon.

There is a complimentary coffee station during breakfast hours from 6:30am – 10am in the upper part of the restaurant.

**RESERVATIONS:** There are two ways to book your convention hotel room:



1) Contact Hilton Cincinnati Airport directly at 1-800-HILTONS (445-8667). If you need a special type of room it is best to call. To receive this special rate, mention your dates and that you are with the International Willow Collectors Convention 2025, as it benefits you and the club. The code for our special rate is IWC25.

2) Go to our website ([willowcollectors.org](http://willowcollectors.org)) and under the 'Conventions' tab, click on '2025 Convention.' Follow the instructions there.

If you have any trouble booking your reservations, please call 859-372-9621.

Note: The hotel is NOT pet friendly, but will accommodate service animals when requested. Please contact the hotel directly for details.

**CONVENTION RATES:** \$145.00 per night, plus applicable fees and taxes. Please note: this rate does not include breakfast, although it is available in the hotel restaurant at a discounted price.

**CUT OFF DATE:** Reserve your room prior to June 11 to ensure availability and rate.

**EXTENDED STAY:** As a courtesy, our special rate is offered 3 days before and 3 days after the convention dates, based on availability.

**AIRPORT/SHUTTLE SERVICE:** Yes, there is a complimentary hotel/airport shuttle service for hotel guests offered to and from the Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky International Airport. The airport code is CVG. It goes to/from the airport every 30 minutes, 24 hours a day. Call 859-371-4400 when you have your bags from baggage claim and the front desk can give you a more accurate estimated arrival of the shuttle and directions on where to pick up the shuttle. The shuttle is subject to availability if guests want to go to Target or something close – there is a one-mile radius that the shuttle will travel. Please inquire at the front desk.

**CANCELLATION:** Any hotel cancellation must be made by attendees directly with hotel.

**EARLY DEPARTURE FEE:** If a guest who has requested a room within the IWC room block checks out prior to the guest's reserved checkout date, the hotel will add an early checkout fee to that guest's individual account (currently, \$50.00). Guests wishing to avoid an early checkout fee should advise the hotel at or before check-in of any change in planned length of stay. The hotel will inform your group attendees of this potential charge upon check-in.

### Tuesday, July 8

Joining the Cincinnati tour? It's best to make plans to arrive today so you're ready Wednesday morning. Find more details in this packet.

**Dinner** (So we can reserve space, confirm participation on registration form)

If you're in time for dinner, join us at Ford's Garage ([fordsgarageusa.com](http://fordsgarageusa.com)). They're serving up mouthwatering All-American favorites in a one-of-a-kind 1920's service station-inspired dining room featuring classic Ford vehicles and memorabilia. We'll get together around 5:00 pm in the lobby and then carpool over. If you can drive let us know! Open to all members and guests. This dinner is optional and at your own expense — but always a fun way to start the weekend!



### Wednesday, July 9

For those arriving throughout today, you can explore the area or settle in and visit with other attendees in the lobby or the hospitality room, where you'll find snacks and games. Bring willow puzzles if you have some (please label with your name). Hotel room check-in is at 3:00 pm. Convention packets will be available for pick-up in the lobby this afternoon.

**Cincinnati Tour + Lunch** (Additional registration. Confirm participation on registration form)

Each year, we plan a pre-convention, optional tour that highlights in some way the city or area we're in. This year's tour takes us to the Krohn Conservatory, the Cincinnati Art Museum and lunch at the Greyhound Tavern. More details in this packet. Both venues are ADA accessible. Seats will be limited on several mini buses and will be on a first-reserved and paid-for basis. We'll meet in the hotel lobby around 8:30 am and leave at 8:45.

**Hospitality Room** (Confirm that you will donate snacks for this room on registration form)

We are fortunate that this year we can bring snacks into our hospitality room and we'd appreciate you donating something for everyone to enjoy. #### Speakers:

##### **Hugh Sykes — "Willow in the Movies & Songs"**

How many times have you seen the Willow Pattern in the movies? Well this July you'll see 20 movie scenes with the Willow Pattern as we present a Top 20 countdown of the best ever Willow Pattern movie scenes. In addition to movie scenes, you'll also get to hear some great Willow Pattern themed songs!

##### **Jeff Siptak — "Art & IWC: It's Worth Taking a Look"**

Join Jeff as he takes a look at the past, first showcasing examples of how willow has been featured in art, and then with a short trip down memory lane to look at a few of IWC's past conventions. He'll also acknowledge and discuss the anniversary of a very special book and note a few individuals who were important to our club's success.

##### **Nancee Rogers — "The Colors of Burleigh"**

Burleigh made willow beginning in 1862 and continues to produce it by hand today. Over twelve colors from those 163 years plus several experimental colors that never went into full production have found their way into my collection. Knowing the history of these colors helps you date your piece. In 2010, the Dornings custom-made willow plates in Holly Red for our "Christmas in July" theme and included a special backstamp honoring the occasion. Burleigh is the ONLY pottery in the world that continues to make "transferware by hand" using this original tissue transfer process. All other potteries either closed or moved to less expensive, machine-made processes to produce their wares. Come see all the colors they produced plus some tissue pulls from our special 2010 plate.

We're visiting two of Cincinnati's iconic visitor sites this year, both in Eden Park and just minutes from each other. Our first stop will be to **Krohn Conservatory**, a botanical garden filled with 5 different houses including a rainforest palm house, orchid house, bonsai gallery, desert house and fern house plus a gift shop. Their annual butterfly show will be running during July, so that's a treat we can experience. Grab a card when you enter to be able to hold a butterfly. The butterflies are attracted to perfume and bright colors!

Then off to the **Cincinnati Art Museum** where a docent will share the story behind the Grant Wood 'Daughters of Revolution' painting located in the gallery. That's the one of "three prim and smug biddies" where one is holding an English willow teacup. We are bringing the same teacup shown in the painting (Wood & Sons!) and have been given permission to take photos of ourselves with the teacup in front of the canvas. After viewing more of the museum and visiting the gift shop, we head to Fort Mitchell, KY, to the **Greyhound Tavern** for lunch. A private room await us with your choice of entrée — their signature fried chicken, salmon salad, grilled chop, pasta medley or fried cod. After finishing warm blackberry cobbler, it's back to the hotel by mid-afternoon. None of the estimated times between the hotel, sites and restaurant exceeds 15 minutes, so we won't be spending lots of time traveling, but instead enjoying our venues and lunch.
